## Poncho Emily - Little one's & Tweens



Knitted in Go handmade's Vintage Hank  
- a luxurious mix of wool and bamboo:  
70% Wool/30% Bamboo, 100 g/240 m



Buttons,  
Stitch holder, Cable needle  
Circular needles: 3,5 and 4,0 mm  
Gauge: One Cable  
= 18 sts/6 - 6,5 cm

## MATERIALS

Buttons: 40 mm, 50 mm, 60 mm  
Stitch holder/wire  
Cable needle  
Circular needles: 3,5 and 4,0 mm

Gauge: One Cable = 18 sts/6 - 6,5 cm

## Vintage Hank

- a wonderful  
wool yarn with bamboo



The bamboo adds softness and lightness to the yarn, and the wool contributes with its well-known excellent durability.

Wool is a sturdy material that requires very little washing and lasts for a very long time. It is one of the reasons why some consider wool to be among the most sustainable materials.

Vintage is perfect for crocheting and knitting small animals that you want to give a "woolen" look. It is also suitable for a nice sweater.

70% Wool, 30% Bamboo,  
25 g/60 m.

## LITTLE ONE'S & TWEENS

Sizes: 2-3 years (4-6 years) 7-9 years (10-12 years)

*The poncho is knitted in a Front part, Back part, polo neck and has a rib pattern on the sides. It is finished by sewing the buttons on through both Front and Back parts (without buttonholes). Firmly mounted buttons helps to keep a nice shape of the poncho. This pattern starts from the Back part. Each cable of the pattern consists of 18 sts. When Front and Back piece are knitted join seams on the shoulders. The rib pattern (k4 p4 rib) is made by picking up the stitches along each side of the work. The polo neck is knitted around the neckline in k4 p4 rib. It is 16 (18) 22 (24) cm long but can be easily made shorter or longer if needed.*

### FRONT & BACK

#### Start the Back:

*The first and last st in every row - edge st.*

With a circular needle 3,5 mm,  
CO 86 (94) 110 (134). Work k4 p4 rib.

The first row is WS.

When the work measures 9 (10) 11 (13) cm, end with a WS row, change to a circular needle 4,0 mm and knit 2 rows in St st.

**NOTE!** On the first row, dec as evenly as possible 3 (5) 6 (9) sts for a total 83 (89) 104 (125) sts.

Continue as follows: edge st, p0 (3) 0 (0),

\*knit 18 sts (see chart), p3\*x 3 (3) 4 (5), knit 18 sts (see chart), p0 (3) 0 (0), edge st.

#### Back shoulders and neck:

When the work measures 43½ (49½) 54½ (65½) cm end with a WS row and shape shoulders as follows:

**2-3 years:** BO 5 sts in the beginning of all 4 rows.

BO 4 sts in the beginning of the following 4 rows.

**4-6 years:** BO 5 sts in the beginning of all 6 rows.

BO 4 sts in the beginning of the following 2 rows.

**7-9 years:** BO 6 sts in the beginning of all 6 rows.

BO 5 sts in the beginning of the following 2 rows.

**10-12 years:** BO 8 sts in the beginning of all 8 rows.

(RS) On the same row where you made the 3rd BO for the shoulder slip the middle 43 (47) 54 (57) sts to a stitch holder/wire for the neck. Knit each side separately: BO 2 sts on each side for the neck.

#### Start the Front:

*The first and last st in every row - edge st.*

With a circular needle 3,5 mm,

CO 86 (94) 110 (134). Work k4 p4 rib.

The first row is WS.

When the work measures 9 (10) 11 (13) cm, end with a WS row, change to a circular needle 4,0 mm and knit 2 rows in St st.

**NOTE!** On the first row, dec as evenly as possible 3 (5) 6 (9) sts for a total 83 (89) 104 (125) sts.

Continue as follows: edge st, p0 (3) 0 (0),

\*knit 18 sts (see chart), p3\*x 3 (3) 4 (5), knit 18 sts (see chart), p0 (3) 0 (0), edge st

#### Front shoulders and neck:

(RS) When the work measures 42 (48) 54 (63) cm slip the middle 29 (33) 38 (41) sts to a stitch holder/wire for the neck. Knit each side separately:

BO every second row another

3-2-2-1-1 (3-2-2-1-1) 3-2-2-1-1-1 (3-2-2-1-1-1) sts on each side for the neck.

**2-3 years:** BO 5 sts in the beginning of all 4 rows.

BO 4 sts in the beginning of the following 4 rows.

**4-6 years:** BO 5 sts in the beginning of all 6 rows.

BO 4 sts in the beginning of the following 2 rows.  
**7-9 years:** BO 6 sts in the beginning of all 6 rows.  
BO 5 sts in the beginning of the following 2 rows.  
**10-12 years:** BO 8 sts in the beginning of all 8 rows.

*Join seams on shoulders.*

## RIBBING ON SIDES

### Right side:

Use a circular needle 3,5 mm with RS facing, and PU sts as follows: PU 1 st in every row. The number of stitches should be divisible by 8 + 6.

Begin at CO edge on the Front and end at CO edge on the Back.

WS: edge st, p4, \*k4, p4\* to the end of the row and end with edge st.

WS: When the rib measures **9 (10) 11 (13)** cm, end with a WS row, BO all stitches.

### Left side:

Use a circular needle 3,5 mm with RS facing, and PU sts as follows: PU 1 st in every row. The number of stitches should be divisible by 8 + 6.

Begin at CO edge on the Front and end at CO edge on the Back.

WS: edge st, p4, \*k4, p4\* to the end of the row and end with edge st.

WS: When the rib measures **9 (10) 11 (13)** cm, end with a WS row, BO all stitches.

## POLO NECK

With a circular needle 3,5 mm and RS facing, PU 1 st in every row for the neck (sts from stitch holder/wire are included). Work k4 p4 rib around the neckline. Knit until the work measures

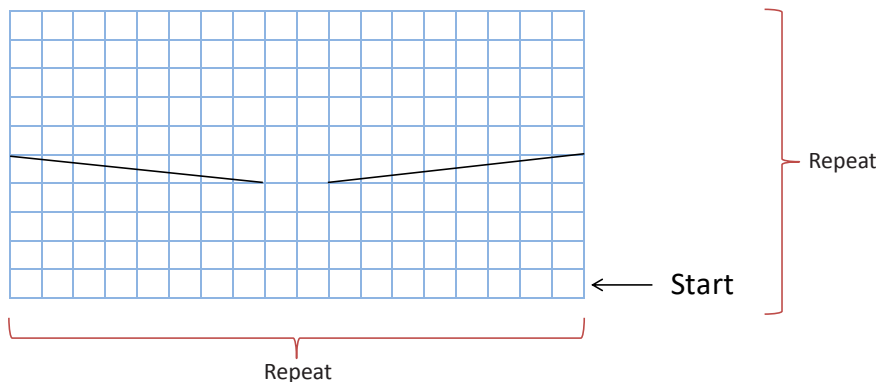
**16 (18) 22 (24)** cm or until your desired length.  
BO all sts.

## BUTTONS

*Sew the buttons on.*

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## CHART



The chart shows one Cable pattern from the Right side = 18 stitches x 10 rows.

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In between every Cable pattern p3.

Row 1, 3, 7, 9 = knit

Row 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 = purl

Row 5 = cable 8 sts, k2, cable 8 sts

On RS knit, on WS purl.



Cable 8 sts = Slip 4 sts on a cable needle, hold in front, k4, put the stitches back (from a cable needle) and k4.



Cable 8 sts = Slip 4 sts on a cable needle, hold in back, k4, put the stitches back (from a cable needle) and k4.

# Good to know

## Needle Size & Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us.

The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.

Therefore, we will recommend a range of needle sizes.



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
