Knitted with 2 threads: Knitted in one thread Cosy - 60% Cotton/40% Acrylic, 50 g/100 m, and one thread Soft Bamboo "fine" 70% Bamboo/23% Cotton/7% Acrylic, 50 g/180 m.

Circular needles: 3,5 mm & 5,0 mm Double Pointed Needles: 3,0 mm Gauge: 17 sts & 23 r = 10 x 10 cm

MATERIALS

Circular Needles: 3,5 mm and 5,0 mm Double Pointed Needles: 3,0 mm

Gauge: 17 sts x 23 r in stocking st on 5,0 mm = 10 x 10 cm

Cosy

300 g

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- A wonderfully soft and high quality

The thread is quite lightspun, soft and with a very special elasticity, which preserves the knit The Cosy yarn is a bit vintage in its expression – warm, strong and even breathable.60%

Bomuld/40% Akryl, 50 g/100 m.

Soft Bamboo "fine"

- a Bamboo yarn out of the ordinary

The yarn contains all of 70% of bamboo, which gives the yarn the softest experience and a special lightness. Comfortable to the skin, it makes it also very child- friendly. The texture is silky with a beautiful drape.

70% Bambus/23% Bomuld/7% Akryl, Sama an amount

GUIDE:

Knit bottom up on circular needles, up to where the pocket starts. The pocket is worked back and forth, while the rest of the work is on hold. When the pocket is done, put it on hold and work the rest to the height of the pocket.

The front piece is knit together with the pocket - continue working up to the armholes.

Divide in back and front piece, finish the parts separately.

Sew the shoulders together and pick up sts for the hood.

Work the arms back and forth and sew them on.

LITTLE ONES & TWEENS

1-2 yr (3-4 yr) 5-6 yr (7-8 yr) 9-10 yr (11-12 yr)

BACK AND FRONT PIECE

Cast on **108 (112) 116 (130) 140 (150)** sts on a 3,5 mm circular needle, place a marker: This is the left side and the start of the round. Work *k1, p1*rib in **9 (9) 11 (11) 13 (13)** rnds.

Change to a 5,0 mm circular needle. Work in

stocking stitch.

Inc 8 (8) 8 (8) 10 (12) sts evenly on the first round - 116 (120) 124 (138) 150 (162) sts.

Knit **58 (60) 62 (69) 75 (81)** sts, place a marker This is the right side. Work **2 (2) 4 (4) 6 (6)** rnds of stocking st.

POCKET

Knit 15 (15) 15 (16) 18 (21) sts, place a marker, knit 28 (30) 32 (37) 39 (39) sts, place a marker, knit to end of rnd.

The sts between the markers are the pocket sts. The pocket is knit back and forth in stocking st while the rest of the work is on hold.

From WS cast on an edge st on both sides - **30 (32) 34 (39) 41 (41)** sts.

On RS, k2tog after the starting edge st and k2tog before the edge st at the end of the row. Repeat k2tog on every second row 2 (1) 2 (5) 3 (3) more times, and on every fourth row 4 (5) 5 (4) 6 (6) more times. On last row from WS cast off edge st on both sides. Put the last 14 (16) 16 (17) 19 (19) sts on hold on a stitch wire.

INSIDE OF THE POCKET

On WS pick up **28** (**30**) **32** (**37**) **39** (**39**) sts on a 5,0 mm circular needle, right after the rib aligned with the placement of the pocket. Knit **2** (**2**) **4** (**4**) **6** (**6**) rows back and forth in stocking stitch.

Continue in stocking st until same height as the pocket.

Knit the pocket together with the front piece as follows:

Knit 22 (22) 23 (26) 28 (31) sts from the front piece, work the next 14 (16) 16 (17) 19 (19) sts together with the sts of the pocket, knit to end of rnd. Continue in stocking st until the work measures: 23,5 (27,5) 29,5 (32,5) 32,5 (35,5) cm. Divide the front and back pieces as follows: Put the first 58 (60) 62 (69) 75 (81) sts on hold on a stitch wire. This is the front piece. The rest of the sts are the back piece.

BACK PIECE

Cast on an edge st on both sides - **60 (62) 64 (71) 77 (83)** sts.

First rnd is RS. Work in stocking st back and forth between the edge sts until the work measures: **36,5 (41,5) 44,5 (48,5) 49,5 (53,5)** cm.

Back piece shoulder and neck

On RS, cast off 9 (9) 9 (11) 8 (9) sts in the beginning for the right shoulder, knit 11 (11) 11 (12) 19 (20) sts, cast off 20 (22) 24 (25) 23 (25) sts for the neck, knit to end of rnd.

Finish each side separately.

Left side:

- WS: Cast off **9** (9) **9** (11) **8** (9) sts for the shoulder, knit to end of rnd.
- RS: Cast off 2 sts for the neck, knit to end of rnd.
- WS: Cast off **9** (**9**) **9** (**10**) **9** (**9**) sts for the shoulder, knit to end of rnd.

Size 9-10 yr and 11-12 yr:

RS: Cast off 1 st for the neck, knit to end of rnd.

WS: Cast off the last **8** sts for the shoulder.

Right side:

- WS: Cast off **2** sts for the neck, knit to end of rnd.
- RS: Cast off **9** (9) **9** (10) **8** (9) sts for the shoulder, knit to end of rnd.

Size 9-10 yr and 11-12 yr: WS: Cast off **1** st for the neck. RS: Cast off **8** sts for the shoulder, knit to end of rnd

FRONT PIECE

Place the sts from the front piece on a 5,0 mm circular needle. First rnd is RS. Cast on a edge st on each side - **60 (62) 64 (71) 77 (83)** sts, knit stocking st back and forth until the work measures: **33 (38) 41 (44) 46 (49)** cm.

Neckline:

WS: Place the central **12 (14) 16 (15) 15 (17)** sts on a stitch wire. Work each side separately.

Right side:

RS: Cast off **2-2-1-1** (**2-2-1-1**) **2-2-1-1** (**2-2-1-1**) **2-2-1-1-1** (**2-2-1-1-1**) sts for the neck on every second row.

Shoulder:

WS: After the last cast off for the neck, cast off 9 (9) 9 (11) 8 (9) sts for the shoulder. Continue cast off for the shoulder on WS 9-0 (9-0) 9-0 (10-0) 8-8 (9-8) sts.

Left side:

WS: Knit to end of rnd. Cast off **2-2-1-1**. (**2-2-1-1**) **2-2-1-1** (**2-2-1-1-1**) **2-2-1-1-1** (**2-2-1-1-1**) sts for the neck.

Shoulder:

RS: On the row before last cast off for the neck, cast off **9** (**9**) **9** (**11**) **8** (**9**) sts for the shoulder.Continue cast off for the shoulder on RS **9-0** (**9-0**) **9-0** (**10-0**) **8-8** (**9-8**) sts.

Join seams on shoulders.

UK

THE HOOD

Start in the middle of the front piece.

Pick up 58 (62) 66 (70) 70 (74) sts on a 3,5 mm circular needle. Change to a 5,0 mm circular needle and knit stocking st. On rnd 3 (3) 3 (3) 5 (5) inc 16 (16) 14 (12) 14 (10) sts evenly - 74 (78) 80 (82) 84 (84) sts. Knit 1 rnd, place a marker in the middle of the back.

Now the hood is divided, knit stocking st back and forth. First row is WS.

Cast on 5 sts, knit to end of row, cast on 5 sts. The 5 sts in the end and beginning make the edge. When the hood measures 3 - 4 cm inc 1 st on each side of the marker. Repeat inc on every second row 4 (3) 2 (2) 2 (3) more times, and on every fourth row 3 (3) 3 (3) 3 (4) more times - 100 (102) 102 (104) 106 (110) sts.

When the hood measures 23 (24) 24 (25) 26 (27) cm, k2tog within 6 sts on each side from RS. Repeat k2tog on every fourth row 2 (2) 3 (3) 3 (3) more times.

UK

When the hood measures **27 (28) 29 (30) 32 (34)** cm, last row from RS, knit the sts together from WS and cast off.

Alternative: When the hood measures **27 (28) 29** (**30) 32 (34)** cm, cast off every st and sew the hood together.

Fold the edge towards WS and sew all the way.



ARMS - MAKE 2

Cast on **28 (30) 32 (32) 34 (38)** sts on a 3,5 mm circular needle. Work *k1, p1* rib inside the edge sts on each side. Knit **9 (9) 11 (11) 13 (13)** rows, first and last row are WS.

Change to a 5,0 mm circular needle and knit stocking st inside the edge sts on each side.

Inc 6 (6) 6 (8) 8 (8) sts evenly on the first row - 34 (36) 38 (40) 42 (46) sts.

When the work measures **5** (**5**) **6** (**6**) **7** (**7**) cm, inc 1 st on each side inside the edge sts.

Continue inc for every **3** (**3**) **3** (**4**) **3**,**5** (**4**) cm, **5** (**6**) **7** (**7**) **8** (**8**) more times - **46** (**50**) **54** (**56**) **60** (**64**) sts.

When the work measures **23 (28) 32 (37) 41 (44)** cm cast off from the RS.

Sew the arms onto the armhole. Sew the rest together in the edge stitches.

THE RIB ON THE POCKET

Can be worked in Cosy alone.

Right side: Start from the top. With a 3,5 mm needle pick up sts along the edge and knit *k1, p1* rib in 4 rows. Cast off in rib.

Left side: Start from the bottom. With a 3,5 mm needle pick up sts along the edge and knit *k1, p1* rib in 4 rows. Cast off in rib.


Sew the rib edges on the front piece.



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STRINGS IN HOODIES:

Strings in hoodies for children up to **14 years** old are not safe and should be avoided, according to the safety standard (EN 14682) for strings in children's clothing sold in the EU. The standard is based on the risk of strings in clothing for both small and large children getting caught.



Good to know

Needle Size & Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us. The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles. Therefore, we will recommend a range of needle sizes.
