MATERIAL

Bling Buttons

Needles 2,5 and 3,0 mm - Circular needle and double-pointed needles (DPNs) for the sleeves.

Gauge:

27 sts x 37 rows stockinette stitch = 10 cm

Width 90 (95) 102 (114) 122 cm
Total length 57 (61) 65 (63) 65 cm
Sleeve length 42 (43) 44 (46) 48 cm

k2 tog Decrease: 2 sts are knit together k2 tog tbl Decrease: Knit 2 sts together through

SKPO Decrease: slip 1 loosely, k1, pass the

Buttonhole Knit over 4 sts: k1, p1. Bind off 2 sts. Cast on 2 new sts in the following row

above the bound off sts.

CARDIGAN LAURA

Size XS (S) M (L) XL

FRONT AND BACK PARTS

Cast on **243** (**259**) **279** (**309**) **331** sts on 2,5 mm N. Knit ribbing st = k1, p1 - altogether **10** (**10**) **10** (**10**) **10** r.

Knit first and last sts on every row. Switch to 3,0 mm N.

Buttonholes

First row after ribbing:

knit the first **9** (**9**) **9** (**9**) **9** sts of each row k1, p1 = from the edge of the cardigan.

At the same time, insert the first buttonhole within the first 9 (9) 9 (9) 9 sts or the last 9 (9) 9 (9) 9 sts of the row.

See explanations under "Abbreviations". Purl and finish with 9 last sts k1, p1 = opposite edge.

Place marker at 63 (67) 72 (79) 85 sts to the left front, 117 (125) 135 (151) 161 sts to the back, 63 (67) 72 (79) 85 sts to the right front piece.

Repeat buttonholes every **6** (**6**) **6**,**5** (**6**) **6**,**5** cm altogether **8** (**8**) **8** (**9**) **9** times

(the **9th (9th) 9th (10th) 10th** buttonhole is worked at the same time as the neckline).

HINT: If the cardigan is longer or shorter, the distance between buttonholes changes.

Hereafter knit all rows as per chart. Knit 9 (9) 9 (9) 9 sts ribbing, 17 (19) 21 (19) 19 sts stockinette st, 15 sts lace pattern (left front), stockinette st until the last 41 (43) 45 (43) 43 sts on the N. Knit 15 sts lace pattern (right front), 17 (19) 21 (19) 19 sts stockinette st, 9 (9) 9 (9) 9 sts ribbing.

Continue in stockinette st and lace pattern according to the chart until the work measures **35 (38) 41 (39) 41** cm from the ribbing *(ribbing not included)*.

PART FOR BACK AND FRONT PIECES

Right front

Continue with the right front
(the remaining 117 (125) 135 (151) 161 sts to the
back and 63 (67) 72 (79) 85 sts to the left front,
place on an auxiliary NI
continue until the work measures
48 (48) 52 (54) 58,5 cm from the ribbing (ribbing
not included).

Begin with the shaping of the neckline.
Slide the button edge 9 (9) 9 (9) 9 ribbing sts on an

auxiliary N.
Bind off 5, 4, 3, 3, 2, 2, 2, 1 (5, 4, 4, 3, 3, 2, 1, 1)
5, 5, 4, 3, 2, 2, 2, 1 (5, 4, 3, 3, 2, 2, 1, 1)
5, 4, 3, 3, 2, 2, 1, 1 sts on the buttonhole side.

The lace pattern is adjusted with the decreases.

Knit until the armhole measures 22 (22) 24 (24) 24 cm.

Bind off the shoulder sts.

HINT: Slide the shoulder sts onto an auxiliary N.

Left front

Knit in mirror to the right front.

Back

Knit in stockinette st until the work measures **21,5** (**21,5**) **23,5** (**23,5**) **23,5** cm (0,5 cm less than from the front pieces armholes).

Slide the central **49 (51) 53 (49) 47** sts onto an auxiliary N.

Bind off 2 sts for the neck on each side. Bind off the shoulder **32 (35) 39 (49) 55** sts. HINT: Slide the shoulder sts onto an auxiliary N.

SLEEVES

Sew the shoulders together.

HINT: Shoulder sts from right front and right back are knit together. That way there won't be any shoulder seam.

Pick up 100 (100) 104 (110) 110 sts evenly along the armhole onto the circular N. Switch to DPNs.

For Size XS (S) M (L) XL:

Knit 3 cm in the round in stockinette st for all these sizes.

At the beginning of the round k1, k2 tog, knit until 3 sts are left on the N, SKPO, k1.

Repeat decrease each 7 (7) 7 (7) 7 rows, altogether 18 (18) 19 (23) 23 times.

HINT: If the sleeves need to be longer or shorter, the number of rows between decreases changes.

When the sleeve measures 42 (43) 44 (46) 48 cm (or the desired length) knit on 3,0 mm N
- 10 (10) 10 (10) 10 r of ribbing st = k1, p1.
Bind off with the last row.

NECK


On 2,5 mm N knit the first **9** (**9**) **9** (**9**) **9** sts ribbing st from the button edge, and insert the last buttonhole (possibly opposite side).

Pick up 30 (32) 36 (37) 37 sts around the neckline, knit in ribbing st (should fit with the button edge ribbing), pick up 30 (32) 36 (37) 37 sts around the neckline, knit 9 (9) 9 (9) 9 sts ribbing st.

Knit 9 (9) 9 (9) 9 rows ribbing sts and bind off with the last row.

Weave in ends and sew on buttons.





- = knit RS, purl WS
- O = yo yarn over
- = k2 tog Decrease: 2 sts are knit together
- \bigcirc = k2 tog tbl Decrease: Knit 2 sts together through the back loop.
- \P = SKPO Decrease: slip 1 loosely, k1, pass the loose st over.

Good to know

Needle Size & Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us. The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles. Therefore, we will recommend a range of needle sizes.



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
