YARN USAGE Curly basserne H 30 cm Curly (Crochet with <u>two threads</u>): 150 g Vintage: 50 g For the nose and mouth, 50 cm of black yarn

Filling Eyes: 12 mm Crochet hook (Curly): 5,0 - 6,0 mm Crochet hook (Vintage): 3,0 - 4,0 mm

Gauge: Tight

YARN USAGE:

CURLY BASSERNE H 30 CM

Curly (Crochet with <u>two threads</u>): 150 g Vintage: 50 g For the nose and mouth, 50 cm of black yarn.

MATERIAL:

Filling Eyes: 12 mm Crochet hook (Curly): 5,0 - 6,0 mm Crochet hook (Vintage): 3,0 - 4,0 mm

All stated yarn lengths are for guidance only.

If nothing else is specified, work in spiral rounds. To finish the work, join the round with a sl st. Leave a 20 cm length of yarn and cut. Pull the yarn through the stitch.

It is recommended that the filling continues on an ongoing basis as the work progresses.

REQUIRED MOUNTING STEPS

Eyes in yarn projects (0-3 years)

For projects for children 0-3 years: Mounting of eyes requires melting of end pieces and special stitching.

Cut the yarn and sew the head together.

Shape the head and the eye sockets:

Thread the yarn a with approx. 25 cm yarn. Insert the needle under the chin and up by the inner side of the eye. Stitch over one stitch and bring the needle out at the lower part of the chin. Tighten the thread so that the pressure creates a depression above the eye. To maintain the pressure on the depression, stitch through a couple of stitches at the lower part of the chin. The depression on one eye is now completed. Repeat the process on the opposite eye.

Good to know

Hook Size + Tension

Crocheters crochet very differently: some crochet with a hook size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design and quality as a person who crochets with a hook size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of crocheters who join us. The key to crochet a specific size is a lot about the crochet style/hands/skills, rather than the size of hook. Therefore, we will recommend a range of hook sizes.
