Big elephant is crocheted in Go handmade's Happy Chunky "double": 100% Polyester, 50 g/33 m.
Small elephant is crocheted in Go handmade's Happy Chunky "fine": 100% Polyester, 50 g/65 m.

YARN USAGE

Big elephant H 61 cm:
Happy Chunky "double" 650 g

Small elephant H 43 cm:
Happy Chunky "fine"
Colour A: 300 g
Colour B: 50 g

A few metres of black yarn for the eyebrows.

MATERIALS

Eyes: 18 mm and 16 mm

Filling

Crochet hook:

Big elephant: 5,5 - 6,0 mm

Small elephant: 4,0 - 4,5 mm

Gauge:

Big elephant: 11 sts/10 cm

Small elephant: 17 sts/10 cm

Leave a 20 cm length of yarn and cut. Pull the
yarn through the stitch.**

Fill the head with filling.

Cut yarn, pull through remaining sts.



TRUNK

Crochet round the opening in the head from the round 16. Start at the bottom of the head in the right corner.

1. - 2.)	14 dc	(14)
3.)	2 dc, 2 dc tog, 6 dc, 1 dc inc, 3 dc	(14)
4.)	14 dc	(14)
5.)	1 dc, 2 dc tog, 6 dc, 1 dc inc, 4 dc	(14)
6.)	2 dc tog x 2, 10 dc	(12)
7.)	12 dc	(12)

Leave 20 cm of yarn to sew the trunk.

Shape the eye hollows:

With Happy Chunky "fine"/"double" which the head is crocheted with, thread a needle with approx. 25 cm yarn.

Put the needle in from under the chin and out at the side of the eye.

Guide the thread around some stitches by the eye and then back out under the chin. Tighten the yarn to form the hollow around the eye, tighten the yarn through a few stitches under the chin.

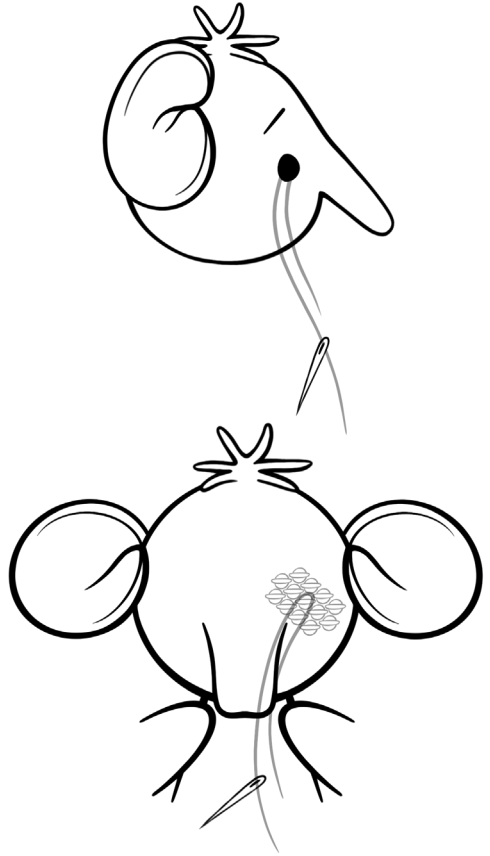
The hollow for the eye is now completed.

Should you want the hollow deeper the process can be repeated and a stitch added towards the top of the eye.

Repeat the process for the other eye.

Embroider eyebrows as shown in the pictures.



EARS (4 X)

4 pieces should be crocheted as you need two pieces per ear.

If another colour is desired inside the ears, crochet 2 pieces with colour B (Little elephant).

Finish and fasten the first two pieces of ear. The next two must be crocheted further as the ears must be double. Put the two pieces of the ear together, back side against back side and crochet through both pieces (in all 42 dc), so it becomes one ear.

Forming the ear:

Fold the edge of the ear and sew 4 sts together. The ears are sewn onto the head after round 10. Sew the head onto the body when everything is attached to the head.

Start with colour B (Small elephant)

Good to know

Hook Size + Tension

Crocheters crochet very differently: some crochet with a hook size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design and quality as a person who crochets with a hook size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of crocheters who join us.

The key to crochet a specific size is a lot about the crochet style/hands/skills, rather than the size of hook. Therefore, we will recommend a range of hook sizes.



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
