# CROCHET & KNITTING

Safe handling and assembling



#### YARN USAGE

Tumble Chanel: H15 cm Teddy: 50 g Vintage: 25 g

30 cm black yarn for the nose

#### **MATERIALS**

Tumbleball:  $7.5 \times 6 \text{ cm}$ 

Filling Eyes: 7 mm

Crochet hook Vintage: 2,5 - 3,0 mm Crochet hook Teddy: 4,0 - 4,5 mm

The given amounts of yarn are for guidance only.

If nothing else is specified, work in spiral rounds. To finish the work, join the round with a sl st. Leave a 20 cm length of yarn and cut. Pull the yarn through the stitch.

#### **REQUIRED MOUNTING STEPS**

Eyes in yarn projects (0-3 years)

For projects for children 0-3 years: Mounting of eyes requires melting of end pieces and special stitching.

## Vintage

The bamboo adds softness and lightness to the yarn, and the wool contributes with its well-known excellent durability. Wool is a sturdy material that requires very little washing and lasts for a very long time. It is one of the reasons why some consider wool to be among the most sustainable materials.

70% Wol/30% Bamboe, 25 g/60 m

## Teddy

Soft like a dream and a yarn many have been longing for, to be used for knitting and crocheting baby ware, teddies and blankets. Use Teddy for cuddle animals to give them a real "teddy" look or knit/crochet a blanket for babies/ toddlers.

100% Polyester, 50 g/65 m.

Place eyes between rounds 7 & 8, with 8 sts inbetween.

Add filling into the head.

#### Shape the eyes:

With Vintage thread a needle with approx. 25 cms yarn.

Insert the needle from under the chin and out at the side of the eye.

Guide the thread around some stitches by the eye and then back out under the chin. Tighten the yarn to form the hollow around the eye, tighten the yarn through a few stitches under the chin.


The hollow for the eye is now completed.

Should you want the hollow deeper the process can be repeated and a stitch added towards the top of the eye.

Repeat the process for the other eye.

Embroider the nose and mouth with a shape like the letter "Y"

7. - 11.) 15 dc Flatten ears at open end and sew to the side of the head so they alighn with the eyes.

#### **BODY (TEDDY)**

#### Bottom piece:

1.)	mr with 6 dc	(6)
2.)	*1 dc inc*	(12)
3.)	*1 dc, 1 dc inc*	(18)
4.)	*2 dc, 1 dc inc*	(24)
5 - 81	24 dc	(24)

#### Top piece:

1.)	mr with 6 dc	(6)
2.)	*1 dc inc*	(12)
3.)	*1 dc, 1 dc inc*	(18)
4.)	*2 dc, 1 dc inc*	(24)
5 10.)	24 dc	(24)

#### Assembling:

The bottom and top piece need to fit snugle around the tumble ball, so they are a bit tight when positioning and sewing together. Sew bottom and top together with the tumble ball inside.

Sew head to top. of the body

# Good to know

### Hook Size & Tension

Crocheters crochet very differently: some crochet with a hook size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design and quality as a person who crochets with a hook size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of crocheters who join us. The key to crochet a specific size is a lot about the crochet style/hands/skills, rather than the size of hook. Therefore, we will recommend a range of hook sizes.



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
